Lifesaving and Meritorious Action Awards

Honor Medal

The Silver Antelope Award, created in 1942, is the regional-level distinguished award of the Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor. Recipients of this award are registered Scouters of exceptional character in their region to recognize their distinguished service to youth.

2014 Silver Beaver Award

The Silver Beaver Award was introduced in 1931 and is a council-level distinguished service award of the Boy Scouts of America. The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor and upon the recommendation of the Sam Houston Area Council, presents the Silver Beaver Award to registered Scouters of exceptional character for their distinguished service within a council.

Anyone may nominate any deserving registered Scouter to the Sam Houston Area Council. The council selects from these nominations, and presents a limited number of awards each year, based on the total number of units registered in the council.
